**Walking tour of Souq Wakif** led by Ibrahim M. Jaidah. Built on the site of Doha's century old trading market, on the banks of the Wadi Musheireb, Souq Waqif feels like an anachronism, particularly against the backdrop of Doha's dramatic skyline. With its mud-daubed buildings, the market harkens to a bugone era while remaining a hub of activity. Its winding alleys offer a tableau of traditional street life.

**Walking tour of Msherieb Downtown** led by Ibrahim M. Jaidah. More than a smart and sustainable city district, Msherieb Downtown is a thriving urban haven, designed to nurture living, leisure and business. Msheireb Downtown Doha proudly boasts an entire city district where all buildings are either Gold or Platinum LEED-certified. The area also holds the world's largest underground car park, featuring an impressive 10,017 spaces. By fusing Qatar's architectural heritage with contemporary design, the downtown reflects timeless elegance.

**Optional: continued Walking tour of Souq Wakif** with our guide, Anna Meshcheryakova. This tour will include areas of the Souq that may not have been included earlier this afternoon. <u>Top things to do in Souq Waqif</u> <u>|Visit Qatar</u> Mosques hold a religious and sacred position for all Muslims. Visitors to mosques should therefore abide by specific ethics and rules and show their full respect by wearing loose clothing that covers the arms, chest, and legs (including ankles) of both men and women. Discover the natural phenomenon of **Khour Al-Adaid**, one of the few places in the world where the sea encroaches deep into the heart of desert, creating a spectacular natural phenomenon where the sea meets the sand dunes, Khour Al-Audaid is recognized as UNESCO-protected natural deserve due to its unique ecological system and biodiversity. Khour Al-Adaid is a must-visit destination for nature lovers, Adventure seekers, and anyone looking for relaxation & to experience the natural beauty and tranquility of the Qatari desert landscape. What to Expect: Pick-up and drop-off from Doha Taking approximately 45 minutes to 1 hour per way, travel by airconditioned vehicle from your chosen pick-up point to the entrance to the desert at Sealine. Brief stop at Sealine to deflate the tires of the 4x4 vehicle for the desert drive off road desert drive through the dramatic sand dunes with our experienced and qualified drivers to the destination of Khour-Al-Audaid (inland sea) in the borders between Qatar and Saudi Arabia.

Embark on a privately guided exploration of Qatar's west coast, traversing from Doha to the culturally rich landscape surrounding the village of Zekreet and Heenat Salama Farm. This journey offers more than scenic sightseeing -- it invites critical engagement with the region's striking geological features, including sculptural limestone formations and serene coastal vistas. As you cross the desert, watch for native oryx, emblematic of Qatar's natural heritage. The tour culminates with a visit to Richard Serra's East-West/West-East, a monumental site/art installation that powerfully reframes the vast desert expanse through minimalist form and spatial precision. Richard Serra's East-West/West-East stretches across more than a kilometer of stark desert terrain, comprising four monumental steel plates, each exceeding fourteen meters in height. Through a rigorous engagement with the site's topography, Serra achieved an exacting spatial alignment that not only integrates with but also amplifies the austere grandeur of the landscape. The work stands as a profound meditation on scale, materiality, and place -- decisively contemporary in form, yet resonant with a sense of permanence and timelessness. Heenat Salma Farm, located on the outskirts of Doha, is a multifaceted initiative by the Caravane Earth Foundation that integrates regenerative agriculture, vernacular architecture, cultural programming, and community development. Functioning as both a site of production and reflection, the farm offers a restorative environment where visitors engage with farm-to-table gastronomy, artisanal craft practices, and ethically curated markets. More than a retreat, it serves as a living model for ecological and cultural regeneration-fostering dialogue between tradition and innovation, and contributing to a broader discourse on sustainability, resilience, and place-making in Qatar and beyond.

This evening, we will step aboard an authentic **Arabic Dhow** and set sail on a mesmerizing 2.5-hour evening cruise through the tranquil waters of the Arabian Gulf. As the sun dips below the horizon, we will see Doha's most iconic landmarks including the Cornish, Katara Cultural Village, The Pearl - Qatar and Box Park, the tour's meeting point. Each turn reveals a new vista, each landmark a tale of culture and heritage -- all while we relax in the comfort of this traditional wooden vessel.

As we are driving, public art will include:

- As we drive on Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Boulevard, watch for an impressive collection of large outdoor sculptures. The works draw on themes close to the heart of HH Sheikh Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice President and Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai: equestrian life, desert landscapes, and the strength of the local community. *The Wings of Mexico* by artist Jorge Marin perfectly captures the city's soaring ambition, optimism and connectivity between cultures.
- Murals reflecting the city's essence and aspirations have popped up on pillars of the Dubai Metro, thanks to an initiative by Brand Dubai. The works of international artists – Peruvian Daniel Cortez and Miamibased artist Evoca1 – can be found between the DIFC and <u>Emirates</u> <u>Towers</u> stations, located along Dubai's main arterial highway Sheikh Zayed Road. Dreamy and inspirational, highlights include the painting of an astronaut hanging from the strings attached to a bunch of planets, as well as a giant floating jellyfish installation.
- If we drive by <u>The Walk at Jumeirah Beach Residence</u> (JBR), we will see unique 3D paintings splashed across buildings, street corners and even staircases. Big, bold and bright, there's plenty to discover thanks to the incredible artists from around the world that made their mark in this popular district back in 2016 for the Dubai Canvas 3D art festival. Highlights include a giant swooping eagle painted on the side of a building, and the huge mural of prancing horses in the sea set to a sky of geometric rainbow colours.
- Dubai International Financial Centre (DIFC) is not only home to some of the city's best commercial <u>art galleries</u>, but it also regularly plays host to public collections of art, particularly sculpture. The district's permanent installations include *Pillar of Fortitude* by Helidon Xhixha. DIFC's galleries are open year-round and offer an ever-changing glimpse into Dubai's latest artistic trends.

# Tuesday, June 3, 2025 (B)
